

Please attend a Public Involvement Meeting for the MPO South Regional Corridor Study

The Harrisonburg-Rockingham Metropolitan Planning Organization (HRMPO) is working with the City of Harrisonburg, Rockingham County, and the towns of Dayton, Bridgewater, and Mt. Crawford on a long-term plan for areas adjacent to Route 11 from Port Republic Road in the City of Harrisonburg south to U.S. Route 257 in Rockingham County, west of I-81. The study will identify a host of transportation improvements that would support future development, including road, sidewalk, intersection improvements, bicycle accommodations and transit services.

All members of the public are invited to attend this public meeting. This meeting will focus on obtaining input from participants on the alternative development scenarios generated by the needs assessment findings.

Needs in the study area were identified by participants attending, and public comments received following, a public involvement meeting held in January 2011. Participants at this meeting will be provided an overview of each alternative development scenario in the areas of transportation, land use, and financing/funding strategies. Participants may interact with the Study Team and view maps of the alternative development scenarios.

Participants will be asked to provide their input on the alternative development scenarios to assist the Study Team in the development of the preferred alternate plan, which will identify a blend of options that best supports traffic flow and safety, economic vitality and the desired character of the corridor.

Directions for Turner Ashby High School: From I-81 take Exit 240 (Bridgewater). Proceed on Rt. 257, 3.4 miles west to the Town of Bridgewater. At the stop light of Rt. 257 and Main Street take a right turn and proceed north on Main Street (Rt. 42) for 1.3 miles. Turner Ashby High School is on the right at the stop light.
